## What is the Ticket to Work Program?

Ticket to Work is a Social Security Administration employment program for SSDI and SSI beneficiaries between ages 18 and 64 who want to work. The goal of Ticket to Work is to increase opportunities and choices for Social Security disability beneficiaries to obtain free employment services and other support services from organizations designated as Employment Networks (ENs) by the Social Security Administration.

## How does the Ticket to Work Program work?

The Ticket to Work Program is flexible and voluntary. Beneficiaries can contact one or more ENs to discuss services. Once an agreement between the beneficiary and the EN is reached, the two will work together to develop a work plan to assist the beneficiary in reaching his or her employment goal. A beneficiary may only assign their Ticket to one EN at a time.

## What are the benefits of assigning your Ticket to The SkillSource Group?

As an Employment Network, the **SkillSource** Group, Inc. is available to support your job search and career goals by utilizing workforce and training services and resources found at all **SkillSource** Centers in Northern Virginia. More intensive employment services through dual enrollment in WIA, the Workforce Investment Act Adult Program, may be available upon a determination of Federal eligibility. These additional services may include more comprehensive assessments, development of individual employment plans as well as counseling, career planning and access to possible job-related training opportunities with Northern Virginia Workforce Investment Board approved training providers.
